

EUROPEAN RESEARCH TOUR

SAPO Trust's Business Unit Manager, Frederik Voigt, recently returned from a visit to Italy and the Netherlands. At the Laimburg Institute in Italy, he learnt more about new certification, plant improvement and multiplication systems used. The research tour to Europe included a visit to two budwood companies, where practical information regarding the selection of unstable apple varieties and budwood operations was obtained. Frederik also paid a visit to the Vermeerderingstuinen in the Netherlands. There he gained new insights and understanding on their plant improvement systems regarding foundation plant material – especially pertaining to the multiplication processes of unstable varieties and pome fruit rootstocks.






TIPPIE (ISMAEL) MALGAS
